Denver Children's Advocacy Center

When a child experiences trauma (abuse, neglect, domestic violence, witnessing a crime, etc.) they come to our little yellow houses on 22nd and Federal, where we help to get child and non- offending family members protected. We also offer therapy to help a child overcome the effects of the experience. Our team of 13 therapists work with children ages 3-17 to help them return to daily life through a variety of child- centered therapy styles. Our services are at no cost and are available to anyone in the Denver Metro area.
