On behalf of Hamilton Middle School, I want to say what an honor it is to support our children and their families. To give our youth the best education, we know that we must help students stay healthy and safe from harm. We need your help to address an urgent threat to our children.

I am writing today to warn you about fentanyl. Nationally, we are seeing an alarming number of drug overdose deaths among teens caused by fentanyl. By learning more about this drug, we can all take action to prevent these tragic deaths.

On November 15th, the DPS Substance Use Prevention Program will partner with the Opioid Response Network and the Harm Reduction Action Center for a Fentanyl Awareness Night for Families. The event will feature a panel of experts who will answer questions from the community about the impacts fentanyl is having on our community and how to educate yourselves and your children about fentanyl. Additionally, there will be a resource fair for families to gain valuable information from our amazing partners and the resources that are available to the Denver community.
